Karen Harms introduced Alpha Beta high school recruitment grant winner Rachel Watson and her mother Lisa Watson. Rachel attends Pontiac High School and plans on attending Olivet Nazarene University working towards degrees in Early Childhood Education and Business.

The program for the evening, "Using Chrome Books in the Classroom" was presented by Alpha Beta members Kate Walter and Michelle Harms. Kate and Michelle have found that Chrome Books work faster and cost less than laptops in their classrooms yet can be used for many of the same applications as laptops. Their students use Google Docs for many written projects. When using Google Docs, files are automatically saved preventing loss of files. With Google Docs the teacher has easy access to student work and the ability to make comments and corrections to the students' work from the teacher's computer, phone, or Chrome Book. Kate and Michelle also utilize Google Slides (similar to Power Point), Lucid Press for publishing projects, and Epic (an online library of over 10,000 books for students) on Chrome Books with the students in their classrooms.

The business meeting was called to order at 7:25. President Carol led members in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance. Carol thanked the hostess committee for arranging the meeting place, dinner, and decorations for our meeting.
